The lines are based on data from a regional study ("Predicting Auckland's Exposure to Coastal Instability and Erosion", available on the Council website). The lines may not take into account local variability, and are not intended for site-specific use.

Development on sites affected by potential coastal erosion may be subject to Auckland Unitary Plan activity controls and may require a detailed coastal hazard assessment report to be completed by a qualified expert.

APPLICATION FOR RESOURCE CONSENT AT 19 Arney Crescent, Remuera BY Carmel Properties Ltd (TCS REF: AO/01/09057)

This is to advise you that resource consent was granted under delegated authority by the Team Coordinator on 25-10-2001

The full text of the decision is as follows.

Pursuant to Section 105 of the Resource Management Act 1991, the discretionary activity land use application by Carmel Properties Ltd to construct a new three level dwelling and relandscaping of the site that:

- Infringes the 2m+45° building in relation to eastern boundary control for a maximum vertical height of 6.0m over a maximum horizontal length of 14.5m.
- Infringes the 2m+45° building in relation to western boundary control for a maximum vertical height of 5.5m over a maximum horizontal length of 12.2m.
- Infringes the required 60% front yard landscaping control by 15% or 17m², thus resulting in the total front yard landscaping control being 45% or 52m².
- Involves removing a generally protected Michaleia tree and a generally protected bottlebrush tree located on the subject site.
- Involves excavations which will infringe the 1V:2H excavation control plane as it relates to the eastern boundary, by a maximum vertical depth of 3.2m over a maximum horizontal length of 17.2m.

- Involves excavations which will infringe the 1V:2H excavation control plane as it relates to the western boundary, by a maximum vertical depth of 4.5 m over a maximum horizontal length of 14.5m.
- Involves 1970m³ of earthworks, which exceeds the 25m³ of earthworks permitted on the site.
- Involves the construction of a new dwelling on a site zoned Residential 2b.

at 19 Arney Crescent, Remuera described as LOT 5 DP 30133, CA / be granted consent.

Pursuant to Section 113 of the Resource Management Act 1991, the reasons for this discretionary activity consent are as follows:

- (a) The granting of consent to the applicant's proposal will have no more than minor effects on the environment. In particular, the form, mass, proportion and materials of the new dwelling are compatible with the original architectural style predominant in the street, which has a diversity of building styles.
- (b) The granting of consent to the applicant's proposal is consistent with the relevant assessment criteria for the removal of generally protected trees, and in particular the removal of two generally protected trees is necessary in order to construct a level and safe building platform, access and outdoor living area for the proposed new dwelling. The applicant has proposed suitable mitigation measures including extensive landscaping of the front yard of the site.
- (c) The granting of consent to the applicant's proposal is consistent with the relevant assessment criteria for discretionary activities, and in particular have minor effects on the surrounding environment, with specific reference to neighbouring properties. All adversely affected persons approvals have are obtained.
- (d) The imposition of the following conditions will ensure that the effects of the applicant's proposal are mitigated, and in particular all conditions relating to the proposed earthworks and excavations.
- (e) The applicant's proposal is consistent with the objectives and policies of the Operative District Plan, and the sustainable management purpose of the Resource Management Act 1991.

Pursuant to Section 108 of the Resource Management Act 1991, this consent is subject to the following conditions:

Activity in Accordance with Plans

(1) The proposed activity shall be carried out in accordance with the plans and all information submitted with the application, being described as Plans 1 – 3, drawn by Paterson, Cullen Irwin Ltd, titled *'Proposed New House 19 Arney Cres, Remuera'*, dated May 2001 and and Engineering Report by Moss Engineering Consultants Ltd titled *'19 Arney Crescent, Remuera'*, dated 25th June 2001 referenced by Council as AO/01/09057.

Monitoring

(2) The consent holder shall pay the Council a consent compliance monitoring charge of \$180 (inclusive of GST), plus any further monitoring charge or charges to recover the actual and reasonable costs that have been incurred to ensure compliance with the conditions attached to this consent. (This charge is to cover the cost of inspecting the site, carrying out tests, reviewing conditions, updating files, etc, all being work to ensure compliance with the resource consent).

The \$180 (inclusive of GST) charge shall be paid as part of the resource consent fee and the consent holder will be advised of the further monitoring charge or charges as they fall due. Such further charges are to be paid within one month of the date of invoice.

Trees

(3) The landscaping shall be implemented and maintained in accordance with the approved landscaping plan prepared by Encompass Design Ltd titled '19 Arney Crescent, Remuera – Landscape Proposal', dated August 2001 and referenced by Council as A0/01/9057. This shall be implemented within the next planting season (ie Autumn to Spring) immediately following the removal of the bottlebrush and Michaelia. In particular the replacement planting shall also include two native replacement trees within the front yard of the site. The trees shall have a minimum root ball size of Pb 95 (or equivalent) and a minimum height of two metres at the time of planting. The replacement trees shall be maintained thereafter.

Heritage

(4) The proposed new dwelling shall be painted in a colour scheme that is compatible with the surrounding environment.

Construction / Excavations / Eathworks

- (5) That the consent holder shall implement suitable sediment control measures during all earthworks to ensure that all stormwater run off from the site is managed and controlled to ensure that no silt, sediment or water containing silt or sediment is discharged into stormwater pipes, drains, channels or soakage systems in accordance with the Auckland City Operative District Plan 1999 (Isthmus) Annexure 14 Guidelines for sediment control. In the event that material is deposited on the street, the consent holder shall take immediate action at their own expense, to clean the street. These measures shall remain in place until the completion of the development.
- (6) That all demolition, earthworks and construction works shall be restricted to the hours between 7.30am to 6.00pm Monday to Friday and 8am to 1.00pm Saturday. No such work shall occur on Sundays or public holidays. The intent of such a condition is to ensure residential amenity is maintained for the surrounding neighbours.
- (7) Prior to commencement of any works on the site, the consent holder shall submit a Construction Management Plan to the satisfaction of the Team Leader, Compliance Monitoring, Auckland City Environments. The Construction Management Plan shall include specific details relating to the demolition, construction and management of all works associated with this development.
 - (i) Details of the site manager, including their contact details (phone, fascimile, postal address);

- (ii) The location of a large noticeboard on the site that clearly identifies the name, telephone number and address for service of the site manager;
- (iii) Any means, such as a restriction on the size of construction vehicles and machinery accessing the site, required to ensure that no damage occurs to street trees throughout the construction period;
- (iv) Any means of protection of services such as pipes and watermains within the road reserve.
- Measures to be adopted to maintain the site in a tidy condition in terms of disposal/storage of rubbish, storage and unloading of building materials and similar construction activities;
- (v) Measures to be adopted to ensure that pedestrian access past the site on the public footpaths is safe and not obstructed during construction works.
- (vi) Location of workers conveniences (e.g. portaloos).
- (vii) Ingress and egress to and from the site for vehicles during site works period.
- (viii) Proposed numbers and timing of truck movements throughout the day and the proposed routes.
- (ix) Procedures for controlling sediment runoff, dust and the removal of soil, debris and demolition and construction materials from public roads or places.
- (x) Proposed hours of work on the site.
- (xi) Location of vehicle and construction machinery access during the period of site works

The approved Construction Management Plan shall be implemented and maintained throughout the entire demolition and construction period.

- (8) No building or excavation shall take place behind a line 2.5 metres from the rear boundary wall, without specific design by a registered geotechnical or structural engineer.
- (9) All retaining walls, fills, foundations and earthworks shall be specifically designed by a registered structural or geotechnical engineer who is familiar with the geotechnical report by Moss Engineering Consultants Ltd titled '19 Arney Crescent, Remuera', dated 25th June 2001.
- (10) All temporary excavations shall be limited to an open face of not more than 3 metres horizontal distance, at any one time and shall be limited to an unsupported gradient of 1 vertical to 2 horizontal.
- (11) All excavations that intercept a line 1 vertical to 2 horizontal from an adjacent boundary shall be retained with a suitable retaining structure designed for at rest conditions.
- (12) Normal supervision of the excavations for the foundations and floor slabs shall be undertaken by an engineer and provision shall be made for over-deepening of any foundations where soft or weak soils are encountered. In addition, the engineer shall certify in writing to the satisfaction of Team Leader, Compliance Monitoring, Auckland City Environments, following the completion of earthworks that the stability of the site has not been compromised.

- (13) All excavations in soils, for foundations shall be protected from the weather. Excavations shall only be carried out in dry weather conditions only and unless concreting follows on the same day, the exposed subgrade and cut faces shall be temporarily protected using site concrete, polythene or a layer of basecourse.
- (14) All spread foundations shall be founded a minimum of 450mm below cleared ground level and into natural ground or engineering made ground. If non-engineered made ground exists at this level, then the excavation shall be deepened to penetrate through made ground and into natural materials. For made ground greater than 1 metre in depth, specific design of foundations shall be required.
- (15) Piled or trenched foundations, shall penetrate through any non-engineered made ground and into natural materials below. Such foundations shall require specific design in accordance with the geotechnical report by Moss Engineering Consultants Ltd titled '19 Arney Crescent, Remuera', dated 25th June 2001.
- (16) All stormwater from any new hard surface (roofs, patios, driveways etc), any groundwater collected from behind retaining walls shall be collected and disposed of into an appropriate reticulated system.

ADVICE NOTES

- (1) The applicant needs to obtain all other necessary consents and permits, including those under the Building Act 1991, and comply with all relevant Council Bylaws.
- (2) This resource consent will expire two years after the date of commencement of consent unless: (a) It is given effect to before the end of that period; or, (b) Upon an application made up to 3 months after the expiry of that period (or such longer period as is fixed under section 37 of the Resource Management Act), the Council fixes a longer period. The statutory considerations, which apply to extensions, are set out in section 125(1)(b) of the Resource Management Act 1991.
- (3) A copy of this consent should be held on site at all times during the establishment and construction phase of the activity.
- (4) The consent holder is requested to notify Council, in writing, of their intention to begin works, a minimum of seven days prior to commencement. Such notification should be sent to the Team Leader, Compliance Monitoring and include the following details:
 - name and telephone number of the project manager and site owner
 - - site address to which the consent relates
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- (5) This consent does not constitute building consent approval. Please check as to whether or not a building consent is required under the Building Act 1991. If a building consent application is already lodged with Council or has already been obtained you are advised that unless otherwise stated, the use shall not commence until conditions of this resource consent have been met.
- (6) If this consent and its conditions alter or affect a previously approved building consent for the same project you are advised that a new building consent may need to be applied for.
- (7) If you disagree with any of the above conditions (except any condition that requires the payment of a financial contribution) or with any additional charges relating to the processing

of the application, you have a right of objection pursuant to Section 357 of the Resource Management Act 1991 which shall be made in writing to Council within 15 working days of notification of the decision. Council will as soon as practicable consider the objection at a hearing.

It is noted that a compliance monitoring fee of \$180 (inclusive of GST) was paid at the time of lodging this resource consent application. Accordingly the monitoring condition (2) is deemed to be satisfied in so far as the payment of the \$180 fee. The applicant is also advised that additional charges may be incurred on this resource consent as a result of additional monitoring in accordance with the monitoring condition (2).

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
